Telehandler Training Courses Mississauga - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their personnel are trained to work competently making use of telehandler machinery. The employees must be assessed for their skill to use the machine. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that staff obtain the needed level of ability. The responsibility level of the individual must be considered when training is provided. Effective training would solve whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Federal, state/provincial and local regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator training and testing. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the use of rotating machines or the use of other attachments. Further training will have to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler requires routine maintenance similar to any other machine. The machine will wear out eventually, so right maintenance is needed to guarantee the safe operation of the telehandler machine. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to monitor, prevent and rectify problems associated with deterioration, damage and wear. Employees require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance directions should be viewed seriously and complied with, considering such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The responsibility for making sure that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the machinery. Pre-use checks are normally done by the user, whereas general maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner.
